Your guide to Real Ale pubs in Dudley Borough

A warm welcome awaits you at the hidden gems of traditional Black Country pubs in this Real Ale Trail. You can enjoy local and guest beers or quench your thirst on ciders bursting with flavour. A little peckish? Then why not sample homemade cobs served in historic settings?

If you want somewhere to stay during your visit there is plenty of affordable accommodation throughout the borough. So, why not combine your visit with one of the many visitor attractions throughout the borough?

Step back in time at the Black Country Living Museum. Experience authentic sights, sounds, smells and tastes from the past and meet costumed characters in original shops, houses and workshops. A warm welcome awaits you at the Bottle and Glass Inn with traditional food and drinks including Black Country Real Ale.

Discover the art of legging along Dudley Canal Tunnel and experience the 45 minute skipper guided tour into the fantastic limestone mines. You can watch the light spectacular show and audio visual display inside the caverns before taking advantage of their Gongoozler restaurant.

At Dudley Zoological Gardens get up close and personal with a huge selection of animals, before exploring the history and heritage of the 11th Century castle.

Stourbridge has been home to glassmaking for over 400 years. You can marvel at the 100ft Red House Glass Cone, which is one of only four left in the UK. Here you can watch amazing glassblowing demonstrations, attend craft sessions to make your own piece of artwork or visit our craft studios, gift shop and coffee house.

Nearby you can also find Ruskin Glass Centre, where you can explore over 20 craft studios and have your own bespoke piece of glass made.

At Himley Hall & Park you can experience an 'Indulgent Afternoon Tea for Two' where you will be spoilt for choice with a delectable selection of finger sandwiches, light bite cakes and a cream tea. Or visit their Capablity Brown landscaped gardens which are open to the public all year round and host special events.
